Xi Calls for Building Community with a Shared Future with Neighboring Countries

Writing a New Chapter in Building a Community with a Shared Future with Neighboring Countries

rom April 14 to 18, at the invitation of Viet-Nam, Malaysia, and Cambodia, President Xi Jinping paid state visits to the three countries. Over the course of five days and four nights, he participated in nearly 30 events, where he thoroughly elaborated on the principles of good-neighborliness, ensuring peace and prosperity for neighbors, amity, sincerity, mutual benefit, inclusiveness, and a shared future. These engagements led to the conclusion of over 100 cooperation outcomes and opened a new chapter in building a community with

a shared future with neighboring countries. They also mapped out a fresh vision for regional cooperation and prosperity, injecting strong momentum into peace and development in both the region and the world.

The deepening and solid progress in bilateral communities with a shared future with Viet Nam, Malaysia, and Cambodia vividly demonstrate China's commitment to jointly advancing modernization with regional countries. In Viet Nam, leaders of the two Parties and countries reaffirmed the overarching objective of the "six enhancements," committing to elevating their comprehensive strategic partnership and accelerating the building of a strategically significant China-Viet Nam community with a shared future. In Malaysia, both sides upgraded bilateral relations and announced the formation of a high-level strategic China-Malaysia community with a shared future, marking a new milestone. In Cambodia, the two nations jointly declared the establishment of a newera, all-weather China-Cambodia community with a shared future—the first of its kind between China and a Southeast Asian coun-

try. These efforts reflect China's sincere wish to share opportunities and meet challenges together with its neighbors and carry major implications for advancing a community with a shared future in the neighborhood.

President Xi has repeatedly emphasized that the fruits of China's development should benefit neighboring countries and help bring about a better life for all. During the visits, China deepened mutually beneficial cooperation with the three countries, injecting new vitality into the vision of shared development. China and Viet Nam signed 45 cooperation agreements, boosting the quality of practical collaboration and accelerating alignment of development strategies. China and Malaysia signed 26 cooperation documents—achieving record outcomes—and agreed to jointly build a regional hub for new quality productive forces, setting a benchmark for highquality growth and modernization. China and Cambodia signed 37 agreements in areas including industrial and supply chains, artificial intelligence, development aid, customs, and healthcare—enhancing Cambodia's development capacity and improving public well-being. Expanding mutually beneficial cooperation is fostering an increasingly close, interdependent, and coordinated development pattern that brings tangible benefits to people in China and the broader region.

China shares longstanding bonds of friendship with Viet Nam, Malaysia, Cambodia, and other neighboring countries. This visit further deepened good-neighborly relations and strengthened the public foundation for a regional community with a shared future. During the Viet Nam visit, President Xi announced China's plan to invite Vietnamese youth for "Red Study Tours" over the next three years to foster inter-generational friendship through shared revolutionary heritage. China and Malaysia agreed to launch a "Confucian-Islamic Civilization Dialogue" to enhance mutual understanding and advance the Global Civilization Initiative. China and Cambodia will take the newly established all-weather partnership as a foundation to deepen mutual understanding and peopleto-people bonds. Closer cultural and peopleto-people exchanges are tightening the emotional ties among nations, giving further impetus to the enduring voyage of friendship between China and its neighbors.

The leaders of the three visited countries all expressed their firm resolve to work with China in steadily advancing the building of a community with a shared future and safeguarding the prospects for a peaceful and prosperous Asia. As one stated, "Viet Nam is firmly committed to advancing a strategically significant Viet Nam-China



Another emphasized, "Malaysia highly values its relationship with China and, regardless of how the global landscape may evolve, will work hand in hand for win-win cooperation to build a high-level strategic community with a shared future." The third added, "Cambodia and China enjoy an ironclad friendship. The decision to build a newera all-weather community with a shared future marks a new chapter of even deeper cooperation." China and its neighbors are important members of the Global South. In a turbulent and uncertain world, they are jointly deepening strategic coordination, countering bloc confrontation and unilateralism, and contributing much-needed stability and certainty to global affairs.







o date, China has reached common understandings on building a community with a shared future with 17 neighboring countries, signed Belt and Road cooperation agreements with 25 neighboring countries, worked to synergize the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) with the cooperation plans of ASEAN and the Eurasian Economic Union, and remained the largest trading partner of its 18 neighbors.

China has played an active role in promoting cooperation under

the frameworks of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization, East Asian Cooperation, Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation, and Conference on Interaction and Confidence Building Measures in Asia. It has initiated platforms such as the China-Central Asia Cooperation and Lancang-Mekong Cooperation, while hosting the Conference on Dialogue of Asian Civilizations. Together, these efforts create a growing web of multi-layered, cross-sector cooperation-reflecting China's commitment to working with its neighbors to uphold true multilateralism. Cl

In 2023, China's non-financial outbound direct investment in countries participating in the Belt and Road Initiative came in at 224.09 billion yuan, up 28.4 percent year on year (equivalent to US\$31.8 billion, a year-on-year increase of 22.6 percent).



Deepened Win-Win Cooperation

s an important platform for cooperation based on the principle of extensive consultation, joint contribution and shared benefits, the Group of Friends of the Global Development Initiative (GDI) represents a major step forward in building the mechanism for GDI cooperation. As of July 2023, more than 100 countries and international organizations have voiced their support for the GDI, and over 70 countries have joined the Group of Friends of the GDI. As an integral part of the institutional development of the GDI, the Group of Friends aims to promote greater complementarity between the GDI and the 2030 Agenda, support UN's work in the field of development, and help developing countries fight the pandemic and implement the 2030 Agenda. It will focus

its work on strengthening policy dialogue, sharing best practices and promoting practical cooperation.


China's embrace of open regionalism has further advanced its approach to shared growth, offering development opportunities rooted in mutual respect and win-win cooperation. As a major trading partner and a key source of investment in the region, China has concluded the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) with relevant countries, and the upgraded Version 3.0 China-ASEAN Free Trade Area is expected to be signed within the year of 2025. Through high-quality development and high-level opening up, China continues to deliver long-term benefits to its neighbors and share the dividends of Chinese modernization.



In terms of foreign contracted projects by Chinese businesses, the value of newly signed contracts added up to 1.6 trillion yuan in 2023, up 10.7 percent year on year (equivalent to US\$227.16 billion, a year-on-year increase of 5.7 percent). The turnover reached 930.52 billion yuan, up 9.8 percent year on year (equivalent to US\$132.05 billion, a year-on-year increase of 4.8 percent).

China Railway Express (CR Express) represents internationally joint railway transport services including container transport based on fixed train numbers and lines, schedules and whole-course operation hours between China and **Europe and other BRI countries.** Currently, three main corridors, namely west corridor, east corridor and middle corridor, between China and Europe have taken shape.

Belt and Road Initiative Benefiting Neighboring Countries

he BRI, born in China's neighborhood and benefiting its neighbors, continues to drive regional development. The China-Europe freight train network now connects over 100 cities in 11 Asian countries. Meanwhile, the China-Laos Railway and the Jakarta-Bandung High-Speed Railway have brought high-speed rail dreams to life for regional countries. Major projects such as the China-Central Asia Gas Pipeline, the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, and the "Two Countries, Twin Parks" model between China and Malaysia have significantly boosted local economies and improved livelihoods.

The BRI prioritizes connectivity of infrastructure. Based on a framework comprising "six corridors, six routes, and multiple countries and ports", a multitiered and multidimensional infrastructure network is taking shape. Basic connectivity over land, maritime, air and cyberspace is in place, laying solid foundations for deeper cooperation in trade and industrial capacity, and strengthening cultural and people-to-people exchanges.

The construction of economic corridors and international routes is making substantial progress. Participating countries have pressed forward with the creation of international arterial routes, building an infrastructure network that connects subregions in Asia as well as the continents of Asia, Europe and Africa.

Major projects along the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor are under way. The Peshawar-Karachi Motorway (Sukkur-Multan section),

the Karakoram Highway Phase II (Havelian-Thakot section), and the Lahore Orange Line Metro are all open to traffic. Coal-fired power plants such as Sahiwal, Port Qasim, Thar, and Hub are operating safely and steadily; the Mehra DC transmission project is operational; and the Kalot Hydropower Station is connected to the power grid. Rashakai Special Economic Zone has reached the stage of comprehensive development.

Along the New Eurasian Land Bridge, the Belgrade-Novi Sad section of the Hungary-Serbia Railway in Serbia became operational in March 2022, and track-laying has started on the Budapest-Kelebija section in Hungary. The Peljesac Bridge in Croatia has celebrated its first anniversary of opening to traffic. The Western Europe-Western China Highway has been completed. The Smokovac-Matesevo section of the Bar-Boljare Highway in Montenegro has been completed and is open to traffic.

Along the China-Indochina Peninsula Economic Corridor, the China-Laos Railway has been completed and is providing sound service, and its role as a golden transport channel is becoming increasingly prominent. The Jakarta-Bandung High-speed Railway, the flagship project of BRI cooperation between China and Indonesia, has achieved an operational speed of 350 km per hour. The contract for the China-Thailand Railway Phase I (Bangkok-Nakhon Ratchasima section) was signed online, and 11 sections of the construction project have started, including one that has been completed.

Along the China-Mongolia-Russia Economic Corridor, the Heihe-Blagoveshchensk Highway Bridge and the Tongjiang-Nizhneleninskoye Railway Bridge, connecting China and Russia, have opened to traffic. The China-Russia eastern natural gas pipeline is fully operational. China, Russia and Mongolia have officially launched a feasibility study on the upgrading and development of the centralroute railway of the China-Mongolia-Russia Economic Corridor.

Along the China-Central Asia-West Asia Economic Corridor, the China-Kyrgyzstan-Uzbekistan Highway is in full operation. The China-Central Asia Gas Pipeline is fully operational. The grain and oil rail transport lines between North Kazakhstan and China are operating in conjunction with the China-Europe Railway Express.

Along the Bangladesh-China-India-Myanmar Economic Corridor, the China-Myanmar Crude Oil and Gas Pipeline has been completed, and the feasibility study on the Mandalay-Kyaukphyu section has been launched. Construction projects in Bangladesh, including the Bangladesh-China Friendship Bridge and the Dohazari-Cox's Bazar rail route, have made good progress. Cl

In 2023, trade between China and the five Central Asian countries reached US\$89.4 billion, up 27% year on year, setting a new record.



In-Depth Regional Cooperation

he Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) is a permanent intergovernmental international organization established on June 15, 2001 in Shanghai by the Republic of Kazakhstan, the People's Republic of China, the Kyrgyz Republic, the Russian Federation, the Republic of Tajikistan and the Republic of Uzbekistan. Internally, the SCO adheres to the "Shanghai spirit", namely, mutual trust, mutual benefit, equality, consultation, respect for diversity of civilizations and pursuit of common development; and externally, it upholds non-alignment, non-targeting at other countries or regions and the principle of openness.

The Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP), which entered into force on January 1, 2022, comprises 15 Asia-Pacific countries—10 member states of the Association of

Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), China, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Australia, and New Zealand. Together, they cover about 30 percent of the world's population and 30 percent of global economic and trade volume.

China—ASEAN relations vividly exemplify China's longstanding policy of building amicable, sincere, mutually beneficial, and inclusive relations with its neighbors. The two sides have remained each other's largest trading partners for five consecutive years. In 2024, trade between China and ASEAN reached 6.99 trillion yuan (US\$968.7 billion), and the signing of the upgraded China—ASEAN Free Trade Area Version 3.0 protocol is expected within the year.

The China-Europe Railway Express connects over 100 cities across 11 Asian countries. The official launch of the China-

ASEAN remained China's top trading partner in Q1, 2025. The region accounted for 16.6% of China's overall foreign trade, with import and export totaling 1.71 trillion yuan (US\$234.21 billion), up 7.1% year on year.

Laos Railway and the Jakarta-Bandung High-Speed Railway has fulfilled the region's aspirations for rail and high-speed rail connectivity. Major projects such as the China—Central Asia natural gas pipeline, the China—Pakistan Economic Corridor, and the China—Malaysia "Two Countries, Twin Parks" initiative have significantly boosted regional economic development and brought tangible benefits to local populations.

China, Japan and South Korea on May 28, 2024 cemented trilateral cooperation and reiterated that amity and mutual trust should be the key tone of the trio's relations to benefit themselves

as well as peace and prosperity of the region and beyond. Chinese Premier Li Qiang, South Korean President Yoon Suk-yeol and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida had in-depth exchanges at the ninth trilateral summit meeting and the eighth trilateral business summit among the three countries in Seoul. Major tangible outcomes include the issuance of the Joint Declaration of the Ninth China-Japan-ROK Trilateral Summit, the Joint Statement on a 10-Year Vision for Trilateral IP Cooperation, and the Joint Statement on Future Pandemic Prevention, Preparedness and Response, among others. \Box

Trade ministers of China, Japan, and South Korea agreed to "closely cooperate for a comprehensive and high-level" talks on a South Korea-Japan-China free trade agreement deal to promote "regional and global trade", according to a statement released after the 13th Trilateral Economic and Trade Ministers' Meeting in Seoul on March 30, 2025





In 2024, bilateral trade between China and Russia reached US\$244.8 billion, a year-on-year increase of 1.9%. China has remained Russia's largest trading partner for 15 consecutive years. More than 95% of bilateral trade was settled in local currencies.

Active Cultural Exchanges and Mutual Learning

n October 24, 2023, President Xi Jinping delivered written remarks to the International Symposium to Commemorate the 10th Anniversary of China's Principle of Amity, Sincerity, Mutual Benefit and Inclusiveness in Neighborhood Diplomacy. Xi Jinping stressed that in the new era, China will work to add new dimensions to the principle of amity, sincerity, mutual benefit and inclusiveness, and champion the Asian values featuring peace, cooperation, inclusiveness and integration, so as to provide new impetus for regional solidarity, openness and progress.

Culture serves as a form of soft power connecting China and ASEAN. In recent years, both sides have deepened cultural interaction through diverse platforms and mechanisms.

Digital platforms such as TikTok have been used to promote the theme "Maritime Silk Road, One Family" via intangible cultural heritage displays and art exhibitions. The 2024 China—ASEAN Cultural Forum was live-streamed globally, showcasing both sides' cultural achievements.

Educational cooperation has yielded substantial results, Over 200,000 students have taken part in exchange programs. There

are 42 Confucius Institutes in ASEAN countries. The China-ASEAN Education Cooperation Week hosts over 70 activities annually and has become a flagship platform for education exchange.

Youth exchanges, including the China-ASEAN Youth Elite Exchange Festival, have nurtured cross-cultural understanding and leadership. Traditional medicine cooperation between China's Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region and ASEAN countries has advanced knowledge sharing and industry collaboration in medicinal herbs and healthcare.

The China-ASEAN Week of Intangible Cultural Heritage enables in-depth cultural exchange through exhibitions and performances. Media cooperation continues to grow. During the China-ASEAN Year of Media Exchanges, joint productions and reporter exchanges produced documentaries, TV dramas, and variety shows that strengthened mutual understanding and public support for building a closer China-ASEAN community with a shared future. 

the well," and has fondly recalled the historical contributions made by the late King Father Norodom Sihanouk to the establishment and development of China-Cambodia relations.



sharing genuine emotions and mutual trust, akin to a family.

Progress being made every month and tangible results achieved year after year



Xí Jinping and the Ancient City of Khíva





On September 15, 2022, the newly built International Conference Center in the historic city of Samarkand welcomed distinguished guests. President Xi Jinping held talks with

President Shavkat Mirziyoyev of Uzbekistan. Among the state gifts presented by the Chinese side was a miniature model of cultural heritage sites in the ancient city of Khiva, restored through China-

Uzbekistan cooperation. This special gift reflected President Xi's personal attention and highlighted a remarkable story of head-of-state diplomacy fostering civilization exchange between the

two countries.

This marked President Xi's third visit to Uzbekistan since 2013, and the "Ancient City of Khiva" has remained a recurring theme throughout these visits.

We must protect cultural relics well

In June 2016, amid a busy state visit, President Xi made time to meet Chinese cultural heritage and archaeology professionals working in Uzbekistan, including participants in the Khiva restoration project. They had been waiting to meet the president alongside other Chinese working in Uzbekistan, when a sud-

den notice arrived: The president would meet with them as a group separately. This unexpected honor remains a moving memory for those present.

"We must protect cultural relics well," President Xi stressed during the meeting.

"Thanks to President Xi's care and personal guidance, China-Uzbekistan cooperation has brought the ancient city back to life," said Xu Yan, Vice President of the Chinese Academy of Cultural Heritage, in an interview with Xinhua News Agency.

Dubbed the "doctor of cultural relics," Xu witnessed the entire process of the project, which is China's first cultural heritage preservation project in Central Asia. Today, thanks to the joint efforts of experts from both countries, sites like the



Amir Tura Madrasah and the Hasan Murad Kushbegi Mosque in Khiva have regained their historical appearance.

From the project's launch during Xi's 2013 visit to Samarkand, to its successful completion and acceptance at the end of 2019, the Khiva restoration progressed steadily, adhering to the principle of "restoring the old as it was." Using original materials, techniques, forms, and methods, the project preserved the authenticity and integrity of the cultural heritage to the greatest extent possible.

In March 2020, President Shavkat Mirziyoyev of Uzbekistan visited the Amir Tura Madrasah in Khiva, following the roads restored with the help of China. He commended the Chinese team's meticulous restoration efforts, emphasizing their significant contribution to preserving the historical and cultural heritage of the ancient city.

At that time, Khiva's mayor, Jumaniazov, highlighted that the Chinese-led restoration projects within the historic city had invigorated local tourism development. He noted that these initiatives marked a new era of collaboration and exchange between Chinese and Uzbek cultural heritage professionals.

According to members of the Chinese restoration team, local

residents frequently greeted them warmly, often offering assistance in transporting materials and bringing fresh produce from their own farms to their accommodations.

of young people working in other places to return home.
